St. Catherine's College Book Scholarship Fund

In 2001 St. Catherine's began to award college book scholarships to our fine young adults who are headed to college to continue their education. Each summer we present these awards to our rising college freshmen. It has been a wonderful gift to our parish and to each of these young people.

The St. Catherine's College Book Scholarship Fund began as the Dorothy Hanson Memorial Fund, in memory of the mother of parishioner Dani Dickson,

and is funded by individual gifts plus proceeds of the annual parish picnic. To date, we have presented over 144 book scholarships totaling over \$28,000. At this time we are able to give small scholarships only to our first-year college students, but with additional gifts to this fund, we hope to expand either the amount of the gift or have the ability to help support them each year of their college careers.

How can you help? Income to the Fund continues to struggle to keep up with the wonderful growth of our Youth program. We are now collecting gifts to the Fund (tax deductible). How can we be better stewards of the blessings God has given us?

This is the question your Stewardship 365 team is asking this year. We have designated "seasons" for five of these blessings. During each season we will discover how to be better stewards of these blessings.

- The first was "How can we be better stewards of our spiritual health?"
We offered two adult formation classes during Lent which looked into how we can better prepare better for our aging, or the aging of our parents.
- The second season is "How can we be better stewards of God's creation?"
During this season we will shortly be offering ideas for how we can all take steps in our personal lives to better utilize our resources. The USA accounts for a little over 4% of the world's population, yet we create half of the world's solid waste. Only 8% of the world's population has access to cars. About 1 billion people in the world don't have access to clean water and approximately 800 million people will not eat today. We have been blessed beyond belief! We need to do a better job of using the natural resources God has given us. Be on the lookout for the steps we can all take to protect God's creation.

New Formation Ministry: The Pilgrim's Compass

First class begins August 15: Celtic Spirituality

The Pilgrim's Compass is an adult faith formation ministry beginning at St. Catherine's this August. Facilitated by The Rev. Julie Johnson, the program will be open to all adults, members of St. Catherine's and in the community beyond. It is a program to equip Christian disciples and other seekers to grow more deeply in their relationship with the Living God. This ministry is meant to supplement more traditional forms of Christian formation such as Sunday morning classes. It will meet at St. Catherine's at different times such as consecutive weekday evenings, a Saturday mini retreat or an on-line class.



The Pilgrim's Compass has two formats: (1) Take individual courses that interest you, free of charge, or (2) Consider becoming a Pilgrim with a plan of study over three to five years. We recommend taking at least one course before committing as a Pilgrim. A suggested plan of study for Pilgrims will include 6 courses; 1 Compassing Retreat (cost for lodging); 1 Pilgrimage Workshop; and participation in an intentional small group throughout your study. Pilgrimage opportunities include local (civil rights or inter-faith pilgrimage, monastery residency); domestic (Christ in the Desert, NM- desert pilgrimage) or international (Taizé, France; Holy Land). Pilgrimage cost varies depending on location and should not be a deterrent, scholarships are available.

The Pilgrim's Compass uses a unique hybrid teaching/learning model. Each meeting combines the best of academic learning and small group discussion with retreat-like components such as silence, journaling, and worship. The program creates a supportive community and meaningful experiences through proven tools which help you to listen to God's personal call in your life and how you might respond in faith. Through journeying together with friends you will expand your knowledge and experience of God and grow in your own spiritual leadership. By God's grace this intentional learning ministry serves as leaven to grow and strengthen the whole community of faith.

Course Topics – examples:

- Celtic Spirituality
- Prayer Toolbox
- Anglican Spirituality
- Contemplative Photography
- Sabbath
- Spiritual Companionship
- Discerning God's Will

The Pilgrim's Compass will generally organize courses quarterly. Guests and friends are welcome. *The Pilgrim's Compass* is an ecumenical partner with The Pilgrimage©, a ministry of The Institute of Church Renewal, Dr. Paul Lang, Executive Director, thepilgrimage.net. EfM: Education for Ministry

Every Thursday evening from September until May, a group of fellow travelers meet in the library at church. We have snacks. We talk about our week – where we felt grace and where we felt trouble. We wrestle with some readings. Sometimes we agree; sometimes we disagree. We look at the ordinary and the extraordinary and muddle through what it means to us and the world.



We aren't there to agree and we aren't there for Bible class. This isn't a class where you are taught things, where you are required to sit quietly and be told what is true or not. It isn't school where we were required to memorize things and spit them back on cue.

There is an old quote that says, "knowledge comes, but wisdom lingers." You can read the Bible and you can sit in the pew each week and hear a sermon to help you understand. But sometimes you need to be able to put what you have learned about religion, what you have learned in life, what you have learned from the culture you inhabit, AND what your foundational beliefs were before all of that into your plan for how your life will go forward. You need to design or craft your own personal theology. Theology is a "big boy" word but it is an important word that helps you to understand why you believe what you do (and what you might do with that knowledge).

Education for Ministry (EFM) is a four year program (you sign up one year at a time) and there is a cost involved. Our church has scholarships to help defray the cost if needed. It is designed for every person to explore and discover what they believe and why. And, even more importantly, it is a place to figure out how you might use that knowledge moving out into the world.

Tom Hunter has received recognition Second Helpings Atlanta (SHA) Volunteer of the Year and their LENNY Award for his outstanding contributions to the organization and community. Tom also received the Mercedes Benz Greatness Lives Here award for his SHA service at a ceremony at Mercedes Benz headquarters in Sandy Springs.

Second Helpings Atlanta, Inc. is a non-profit food rescue organization whose mission is to reduce hunger and food waste in the metropolitan Atlanta area by rescuing surplus food and delivering it to those in need. With more than 450 active volunteers, SHA serves as the link between its current network of over 80 Food Donors and more than 50 Partner Agencies who feed the hungry on a daily basis. In 2018, SHA rescued a total of 1,635,945 pounds of food, enough for 1,363,287 healthy meals. In total, SHA managed 7,952 pick-ups and deliveries (an average of 153 per week), and the average food rescue was 206 pounds (=172 meals). To learn more visit www.seconhelpingsatlanta.org.
